HOW TO CREATE A READY MADE SHARED CAMPAIGN

(PRO MEMBERS FEATURE)

The shared campaign creation is a feature available with the Pro service pack. Pro members may create Ready Made Shared campaigns, that can be loaded in their autoresponder account by any other AIOP member if has a granted access to the shared campaign.

Basic members may only load(copy) a shared campaign.

The shared campaign may be attached to a Ready Made Lead Capture Page (LCP).

In the process of copying the ready made campaign, the lead capture page is also copied and the links will be duplicated. This feature requires always a php code page not a html, in order to allow the duplication.

Html pages may be copied and saved as php extension.

You can use a page created or copied on your web hosting account, or use a LCP made using AIOP Splashbuilder, copied on your hosting account and saved as php page extension. This is simple and will be explained .

We will explain below how to create a shared campaign and attach it to a capture page made in AIOP splashbuilder .

I. How to create the ready made shared campaign

1. Create the shared campaign.

Log in your autoresponder and click Campaigns.

Make a shared campaign



The campaign you create to be shared with other people, have some special rules that make it working proper, we will explain later about that.

When you create your ready made shared campaign you need to fill in the **"Add a new campaign"** box for your created shared campaign, with your own details, so you will be able to use it too.

You only have to fill in once.

When a user will copy your campaign, he/she has to fill in that campaign form boxes, because hasn't the same name / id / email as you do.

They will not see your details but just the empty box to fill it out with their own details.

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Warning, shared campaigns have some special rules.

When you share a campaign, your email address will be shown with the campaign.

You need to fill in a clear description, so people will know what they copy.

You need to replace the username in links with [[user]] in the follow ups letters when you create the shared campaign!

So all links will be personal.

On the campaign screen, you can set the campaign to: shared, hidden or not being shared.

Please DO NOT set the campaign to shared BEFORE you have the follow ups ready and tested.

You are allowed to share 3 capture pages. These pages need to have .php extension (page can be in html).

The shared capture pages have special HTML sign up forms (with a bit php)

and will sign up the new subscribers to the correct user.

You can not use the AIOF-Splashbuilder to create a capture page for a shared campaign

The special form won't work there.

you need to create your own capture page and host it yourself (you can use your hosting account for that).

After you fill in your personal details there press **Submit shared campaign** and you'll be taken to a new screen where you will see that your new shared campaign is already created.

The shared campaigns will always list a username /ID for that campaign that will show in the username/ID column. The regular campaigns will not list any username for the offers you promote.

The campaign has a unique number. You will give this number to those copying your ready made campaign when you choose the attribute **Hidden**. If you choose Public, then all the AIOP_response users will see your campaign and can copy it.

2. Add the follow up letters to your new ready made campaign

WARNING: 1) No matter the campaign you want to work with, edit or just check it, you have to be sure that you made that campaign **ACTIVE**, and you are logged in the campaign you want to work with. You can always do that by clicking the "**Go**" button.

2) Please **do NOT share a campaign before testing it**, until you are sure that looks as it should look and the links and variables are correctly set.

What you have to do further, is to add your letters and test them and to add your ready made shared lead capture page links.

We recommend you to write first the letters as txt file using a NotePad , then copy and paste the letters text into the editor using the HTML option.

Why NotePad txt file for email draft?

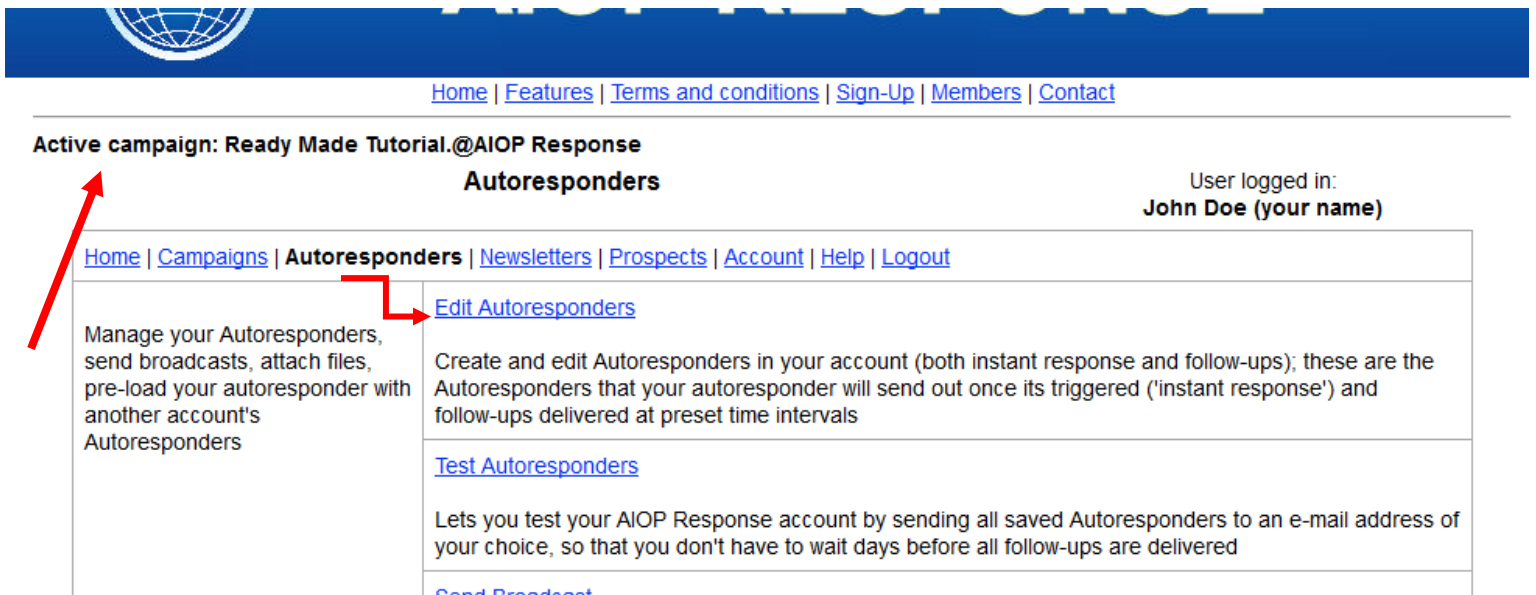
Because a word doc has a specific html encoded and that may interfere or not with other html editor - in our case the autoresponder html editor and may appear some errors. Better be cautious.

Why using the html option of the editor?

Because looks way much better than the simple text version and gives you the option to add fonts, sizes, images, colours, tables, email templates, html coded templates and much more, to make the email looking more professional.

So choose your ready made shared campaign new created and add the autoresponder follow up letters to it.

Click "**Autoresponders**" and start adding your letters.

The campaign you create to be shared with other people, have some special rules that will make it working proper.

When **adding the follow up letters** to the campaign you need to use some specific variables, short codes that will be replaced by the personal details of the people who copy your campaign.

So that in your campaign letters :

- you need to replace the username in links with the variable **[[user]]** (links that will be in your email body)

That code will be replaced by the referral **username** or **ID** for the program you promote, for those who will copy the campaign from you. *For example only:*
yourbusinessname.com/?...[[user]]

- the variable **[[uname]]** will be replaced by the user name (not the subscriber but the people who copy the campaign)
- the variable **[[uemail]]** will be replaced by the email of the user

You may also use all the other variables available in autoresponder but these are specific for the shared campaign.

If they are not used in your emails, the campaign will not work for those copying it.

- **Click Autoresponders >> Edit Autoresponders >>>Editor html**
- **Add your email Subject**
- **Set the time**
- **Add the email body you wrote on your text doc**
- **Edit your email body as you want**

COPY THE EMAIL BODY (OR THE EMAIL HTML)- in case you may be timed out by the system for security reasons.

- **Then press ADD MESSAGE**

OPTIONAL:

You can add an **Opt in url**, replacing the Opt in url from the default system page to the page you want, **after** the prospect clicks the confirm link in the confirmation email.

Make sure you are logged in the shared campaign, click **Account**, then click **Edit Settings**. Look for **Change** the Opt-in URL.

WARNING: you must use the same URL that is used in your emails, with the referral link containing **[[user]]** otherwise, the shared campaign **will not work proper for the people you share with.**

3. Generate the Sign up form code for your campaign

[Tracking](#)

Helps you determine where your prospects came from;

[Variables](#)

This is your list of custom variables. Each variable is also accompanied with by its description. You can edit and/or remove variables from this screen.

- You can add more fields to your sign up form from those already available or add your own custom fields to extract the details you need from your sign up prospects.
- You can add optional, a Redirect URL.

After people fill in the sign up form, they will see a default system Thank you page.

On the system thank you page there is a link "Click here" to continue. When they click that link, they will see the page you set as Redirect URL.

Warning: This is a shared campaign so the only redirect URL you should use is the **same referral link** you will use in your emails, meaning **the url containing the [[user]]** code. **BETTER USE NO REDIRECT URL HERE.**

Customize your Sign up form and press generate

If you want to add the referral link as Return URL, make sure is the same referral link as in emails. With the [[user]] code.

NOTE: You cannot save the form here, for a shared campaign.

You can alter or customize the html form code as you want.

The "Powered by AIOP" links to company by default, but you **have the option to** remove it completely. For that, check the html code for the link and just remove it.

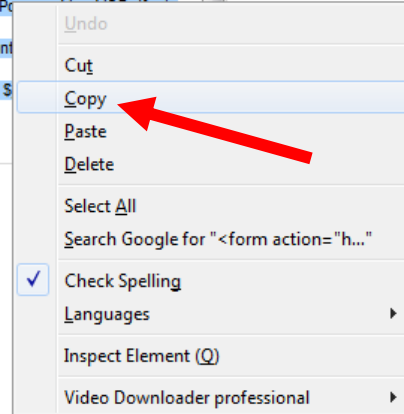

- If you already have made the page, just Copy the form code and Paste it into the sign up form spot, on your page.
- If you don't have the page made yet, then just Copy the form code and paste it in a file on your desktop to add it later, when the page is ready.
- If you want, you can come back later, after you have the page ready, and generate a form code.

II. How to create the Ready Made Shared Lead Capture Page

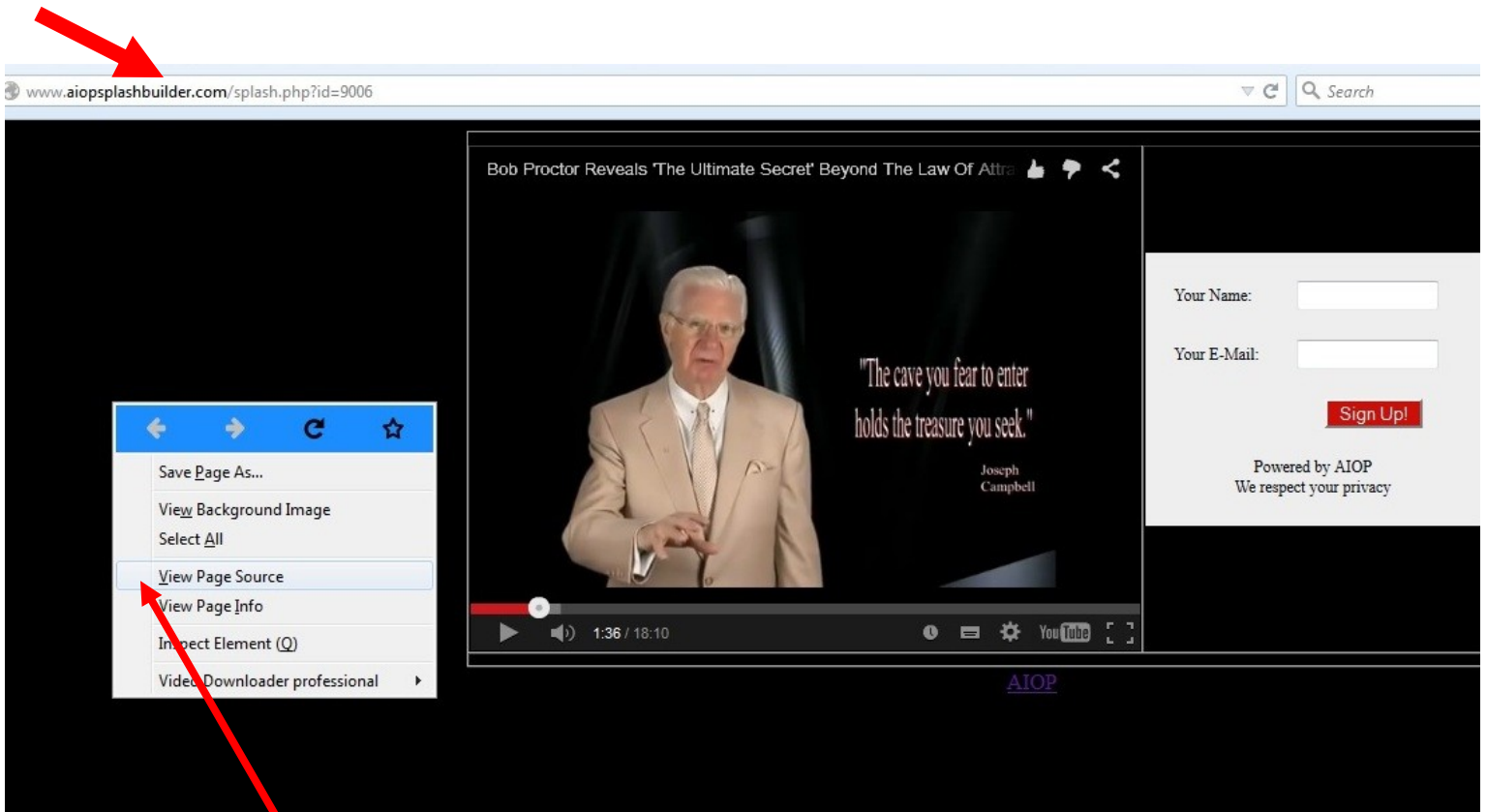
You can use a page made with AIOP splashbuilder, or a WordPress page or a page made on your web hosting cPanel. If you create a page using HTML code you can save it as php too.

We will use as example a page made in AIOP splashbuilder.

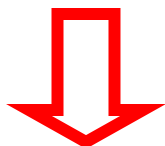
1. Make your original lead capture page. Add the shared campaign sign up form, save and test the page.

2. Open your page in browser.

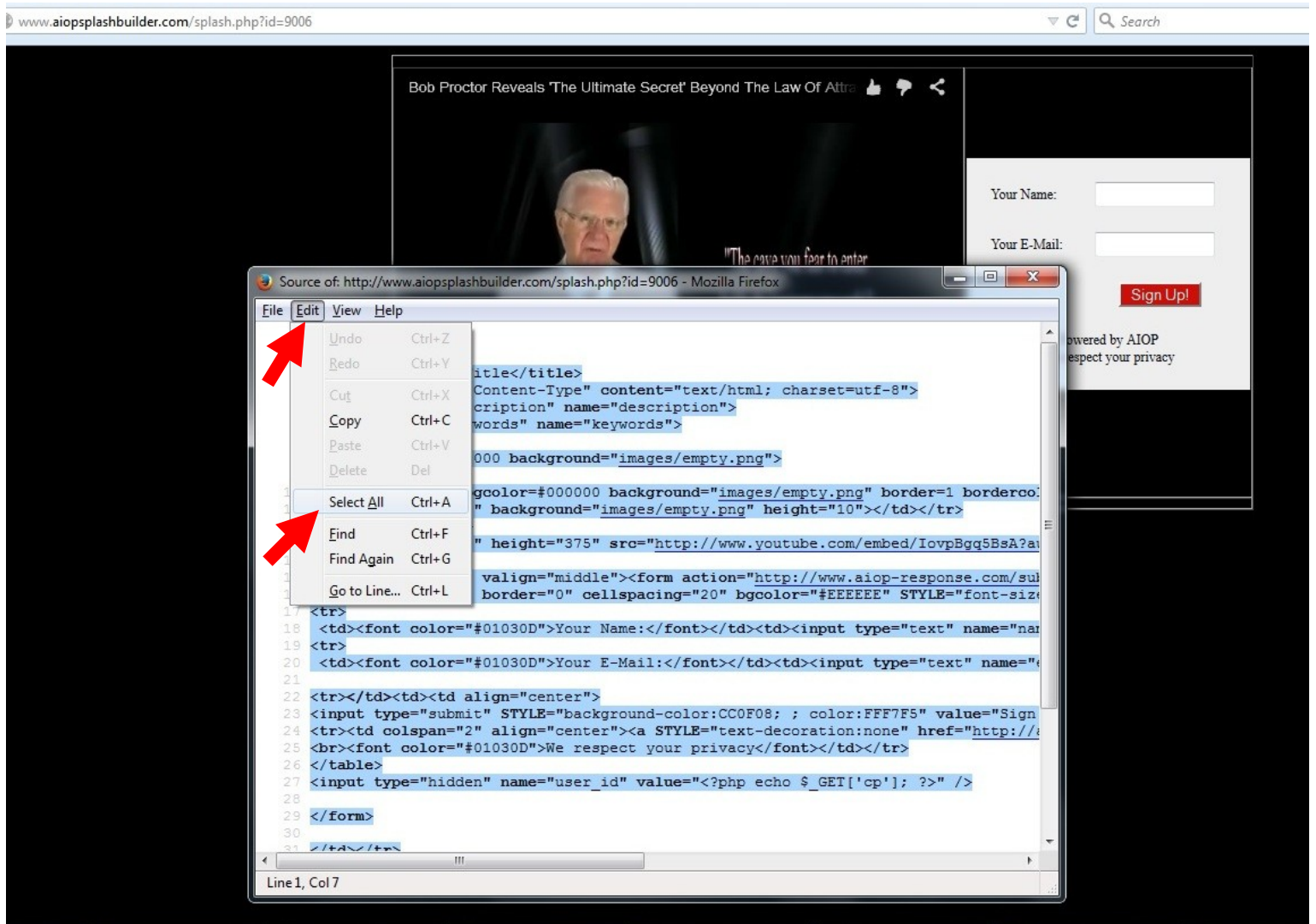
Right click on page, choose "**View page source**". Opens a pop up window.



The pop up contains the page source code.



Click on "Edit" then "Select All". You may choose to keep the pop up window opened on your desktop taskbar or copy the code on a text file.



Go to your hosting cPanel.

Click on "File manager" and choose "public_html." On the next screen, in "File Manager Settings", on top menu, choose "New File". A pop up will open "Create a new file". Name the new file as you want your page to be named BUT use always the extension **php** . Click Create.

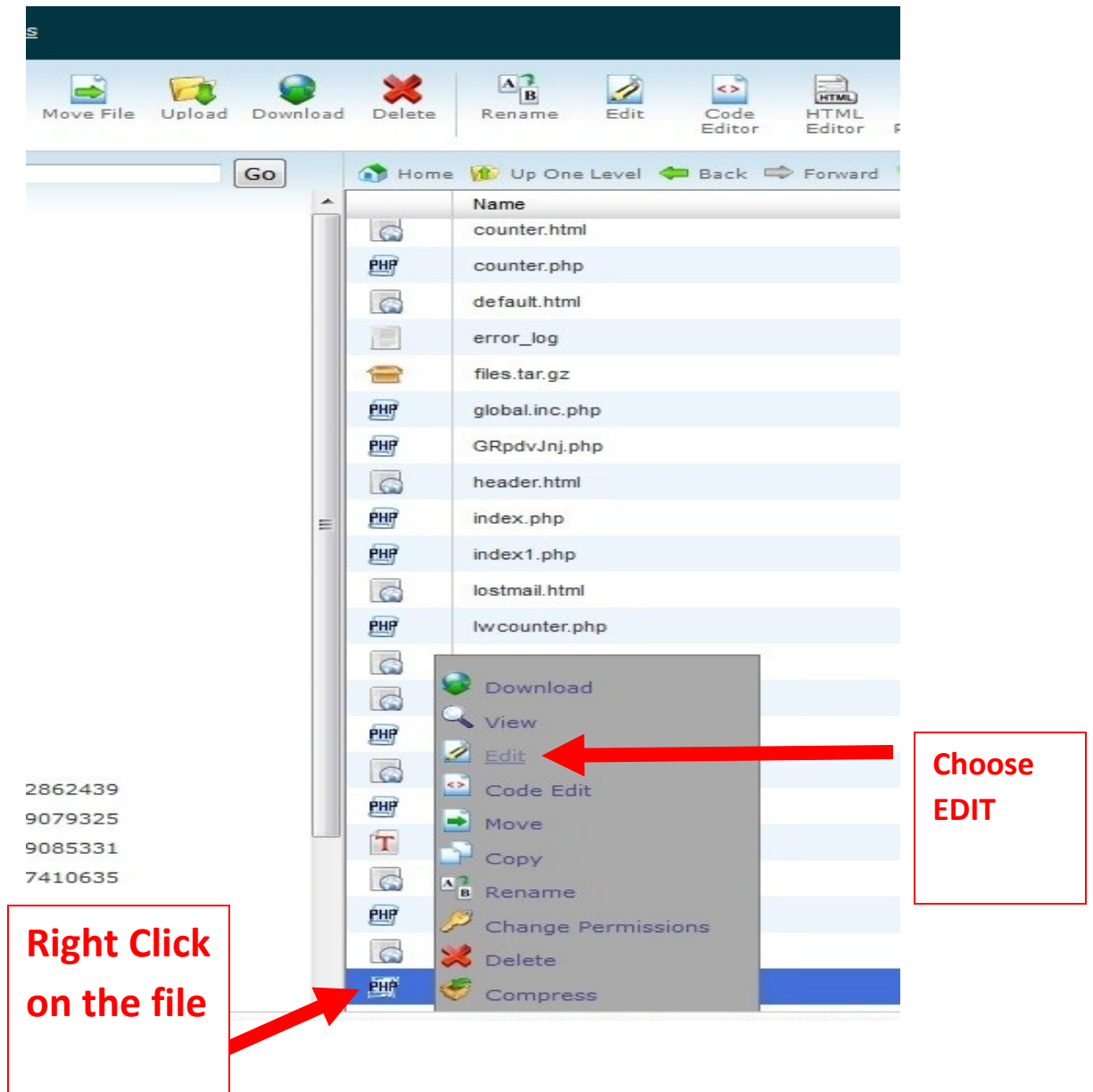

Look for your new created file, select it and right click on it. Will open a small pop up. Choose EDIT.



When you click **Edit**, the page will open in a new browser tab and lets you edit it.

Assuming that you kept the pop up with your page source code opened in desktop taskbar, open it and copy the Source code of the Original page.

Paste the code into your New file. Click Save. Click Close.

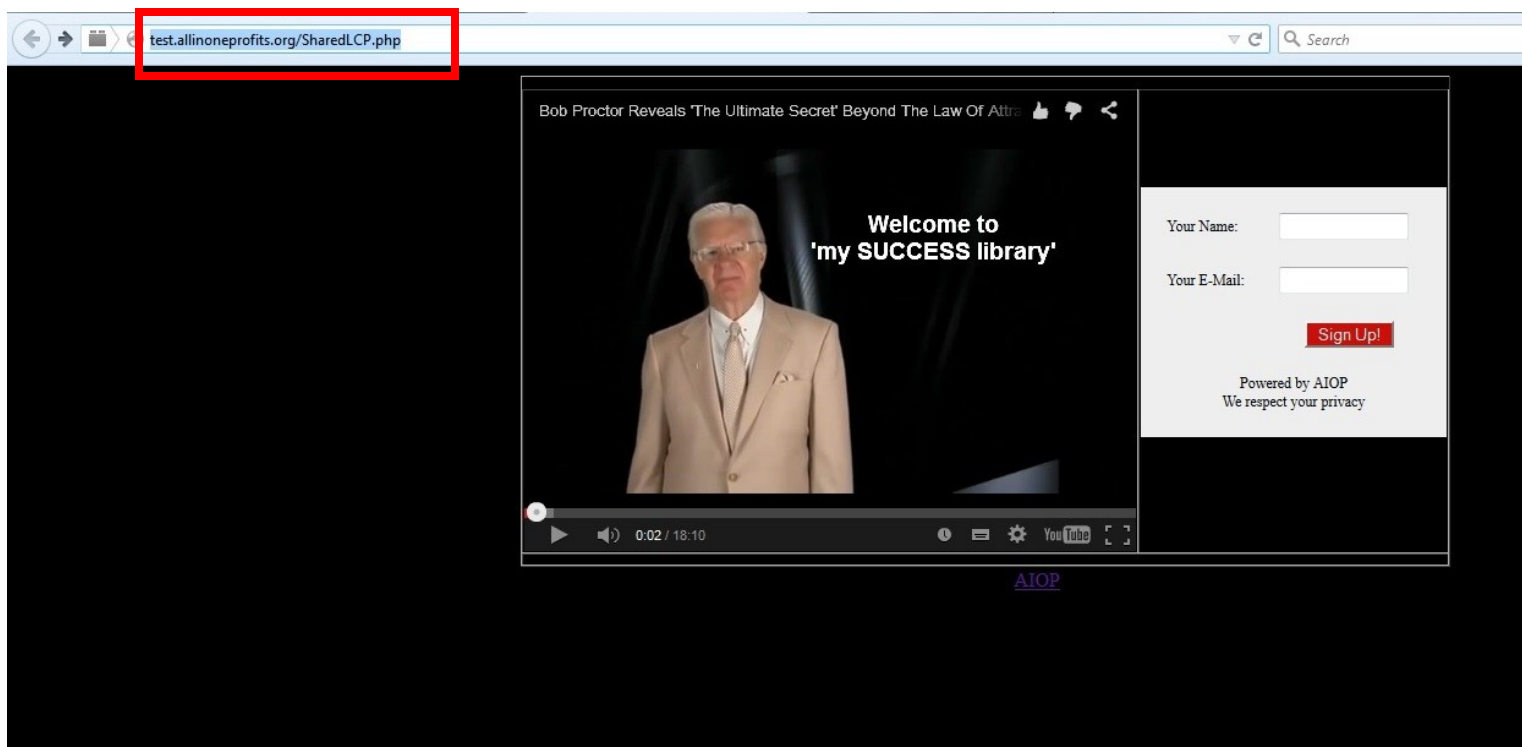

Open the new page link in browser, and test it to see if looks as the original page. Text the Sign up form too.



Once you have your php page tested, go to your shared campaign in autoresponder and add the page.

You can add 3 pages to the same shared campaign.

Note that when is added, the page has no referral link or any ID but only the direct link to your php page.

<http://yourdomain.com/yourpagename.php>

To promote for yourself as referral of the program you advertise, you will need to load the campaign as simple user, following the steps for loading a shared campaign. So you will have a duplicate page with your username too.

Is a good way to test and see how will work for your referrals or team.

To update the follow ups to the last version, click premade campaigns and click the reload button for this campaign.

You can set your shared campaign to be **Hidden or Public**, but before doing this please, Do Not share the campaign and the page until you test it and know that everything is as you want to be.

If you set the shared campaign as Public, all the AIOP Response users will see it, that is why recommend to set it as **Hidden** and give the campaign number to your people.

Additional NOTE

If you made the original page in AIOP Splashbuilder or in WordPress, the images links are absolute so will show correctly, no need to edit anything **if you use the same server.**

Consider that:

-If you use a HTML website builder to make your original page, upload it on your cpanel and save it as php page;

-If your copied page is made on a different server than the original page;

Then:

You need to check out the images. The images may not have absolute links.

If the images show correctly is ok.

If they don't show correctly, you need to edit the images links by adding or replacing the domain url before the each image link.

OR to upload the images on the server where you make the php copy.

See the example below:
